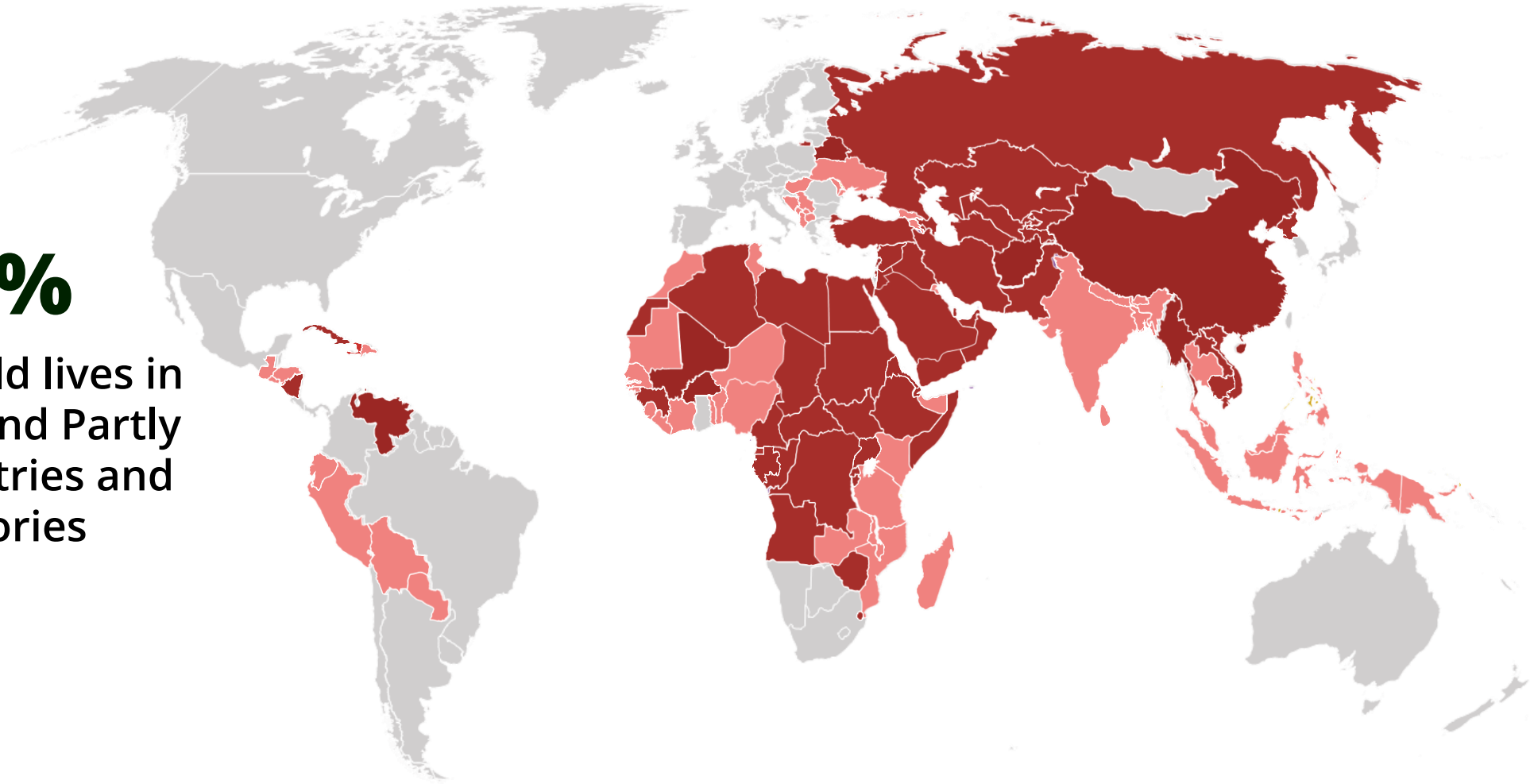

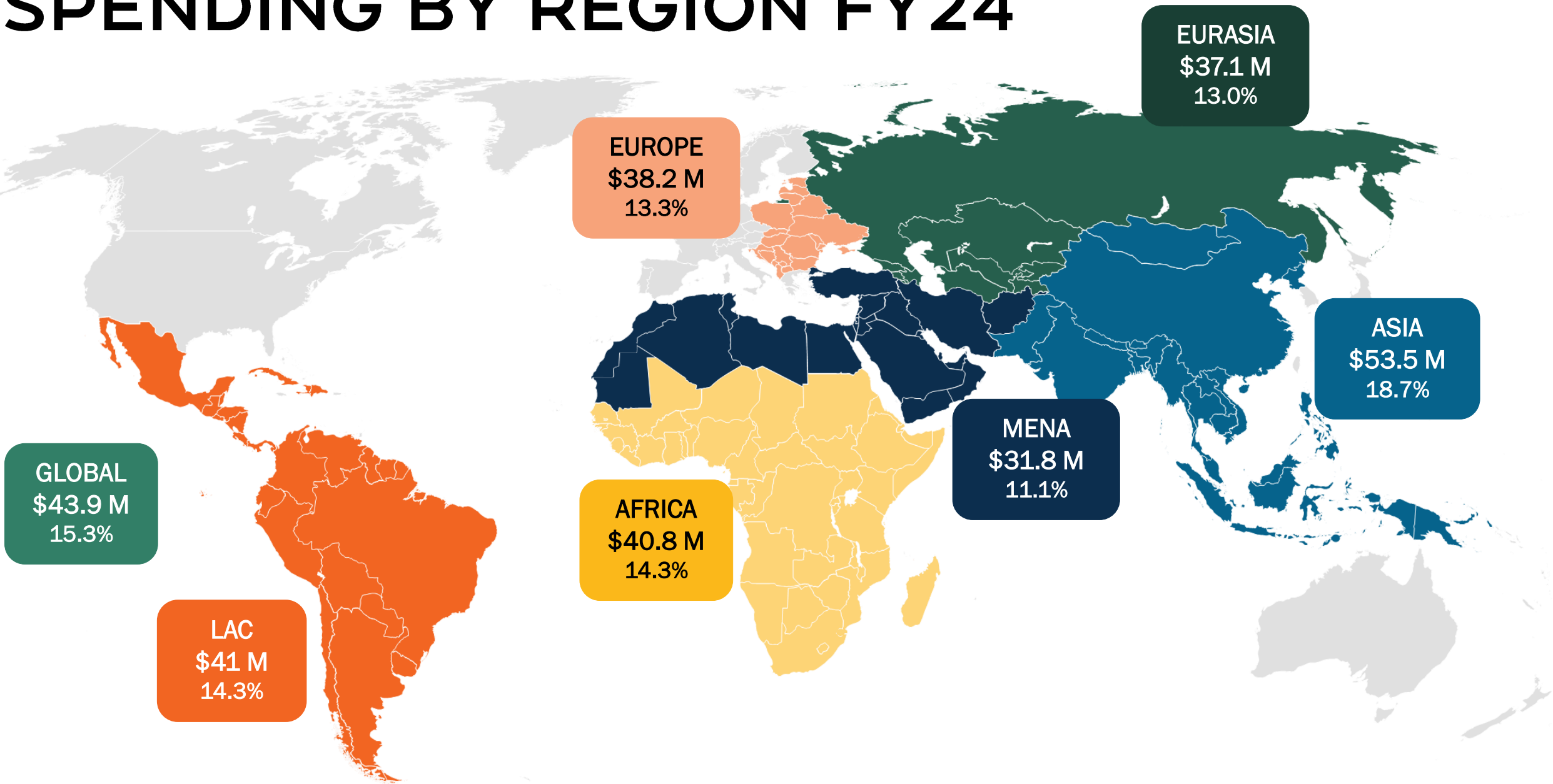

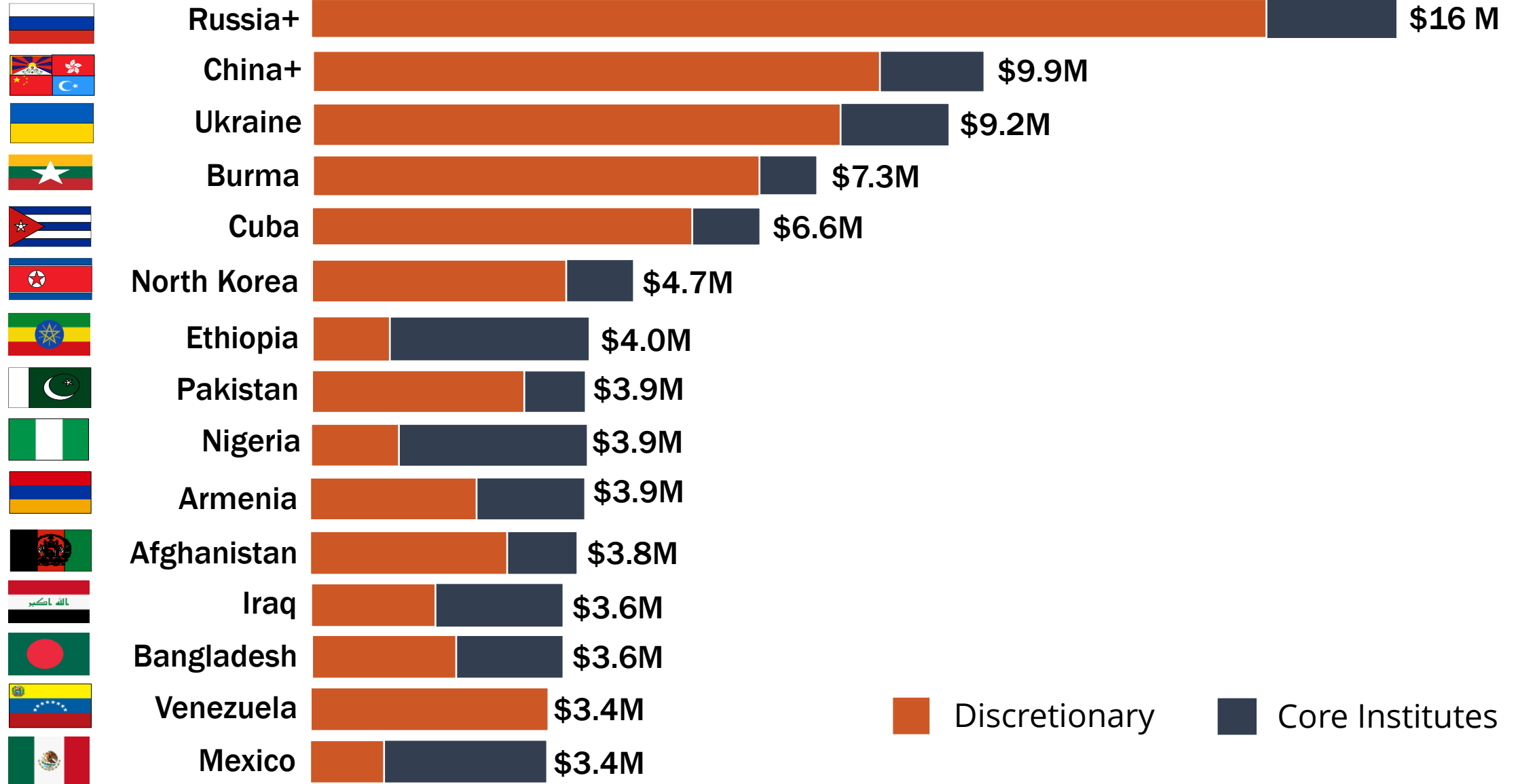

SPENDING BY REGION FY24

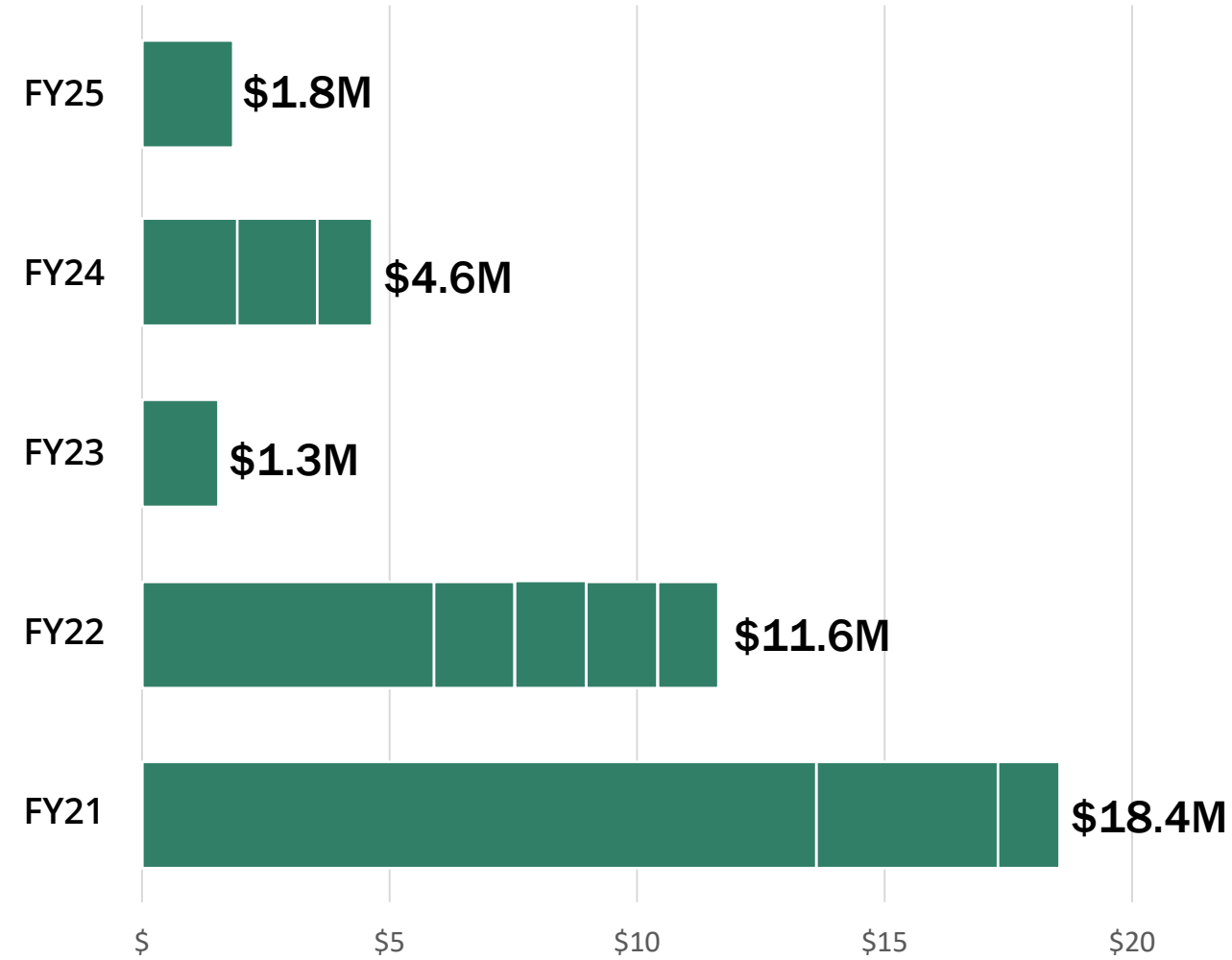


FY24 TOP 15 COUNTRY PORTFOLIOS

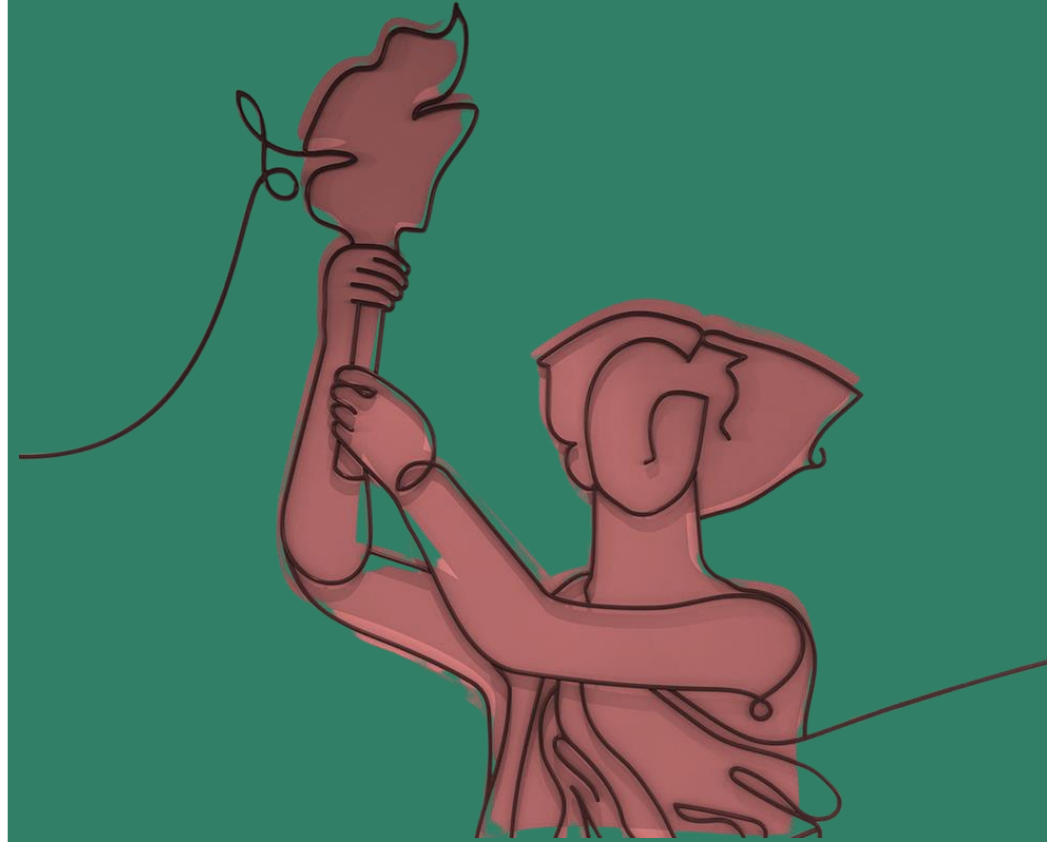

NED classifies countries with a score of 25 or less on Freedom House's scale as the **most repressive** and concentrates 33% of its grantmaking on those countries.

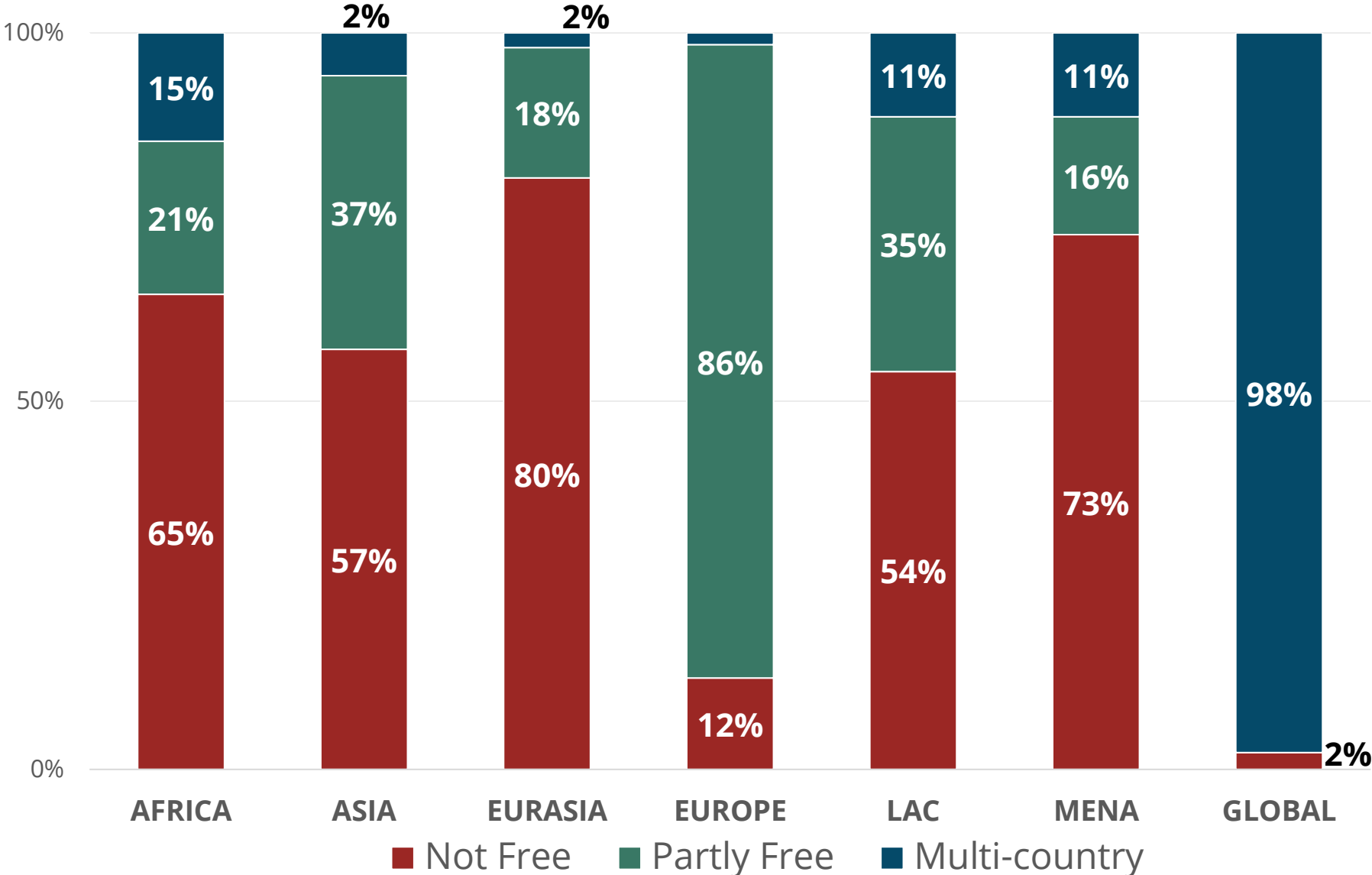

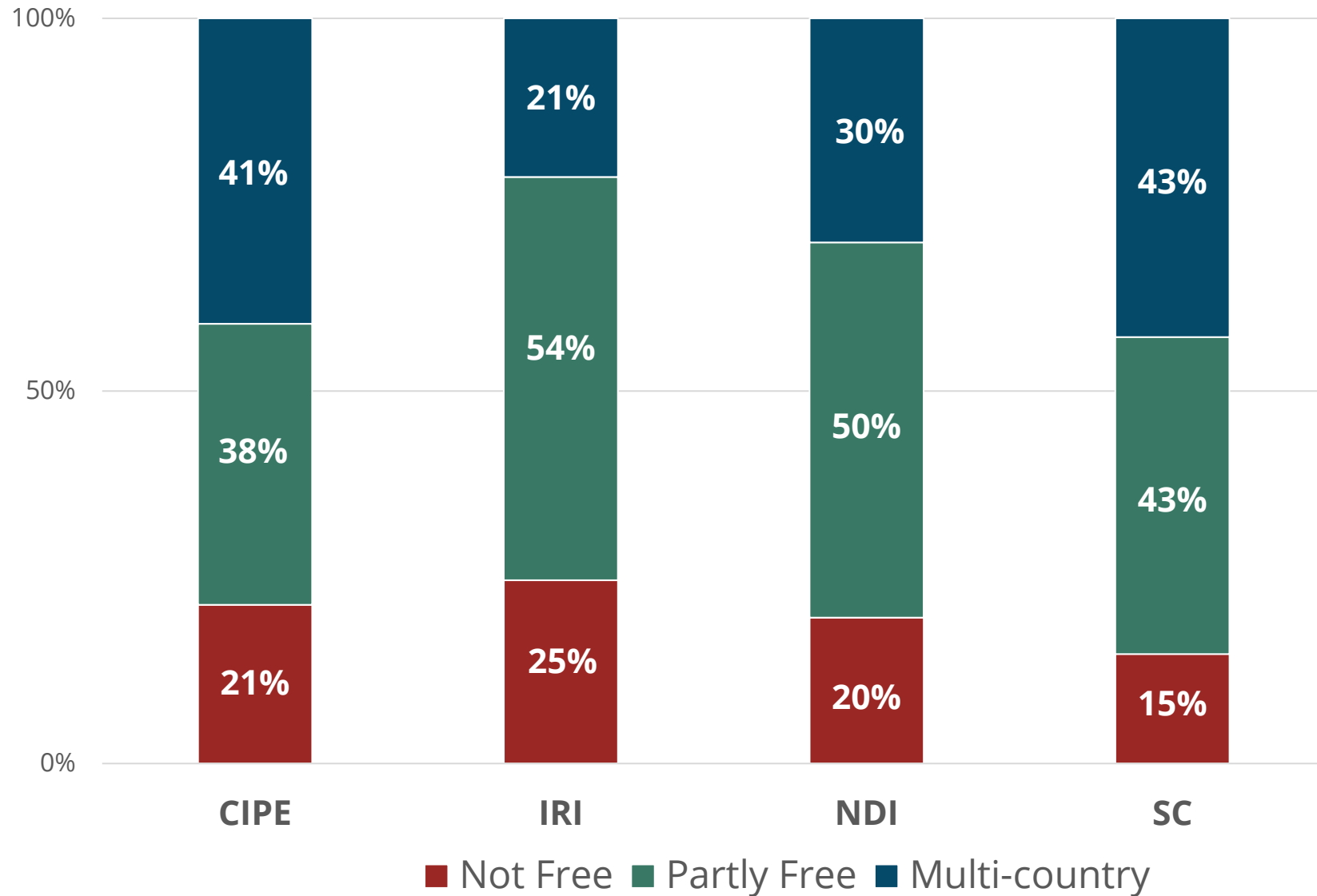
DISCRETIONARY FUNDING

NED prioritizes working in the most repressive and least free countries.



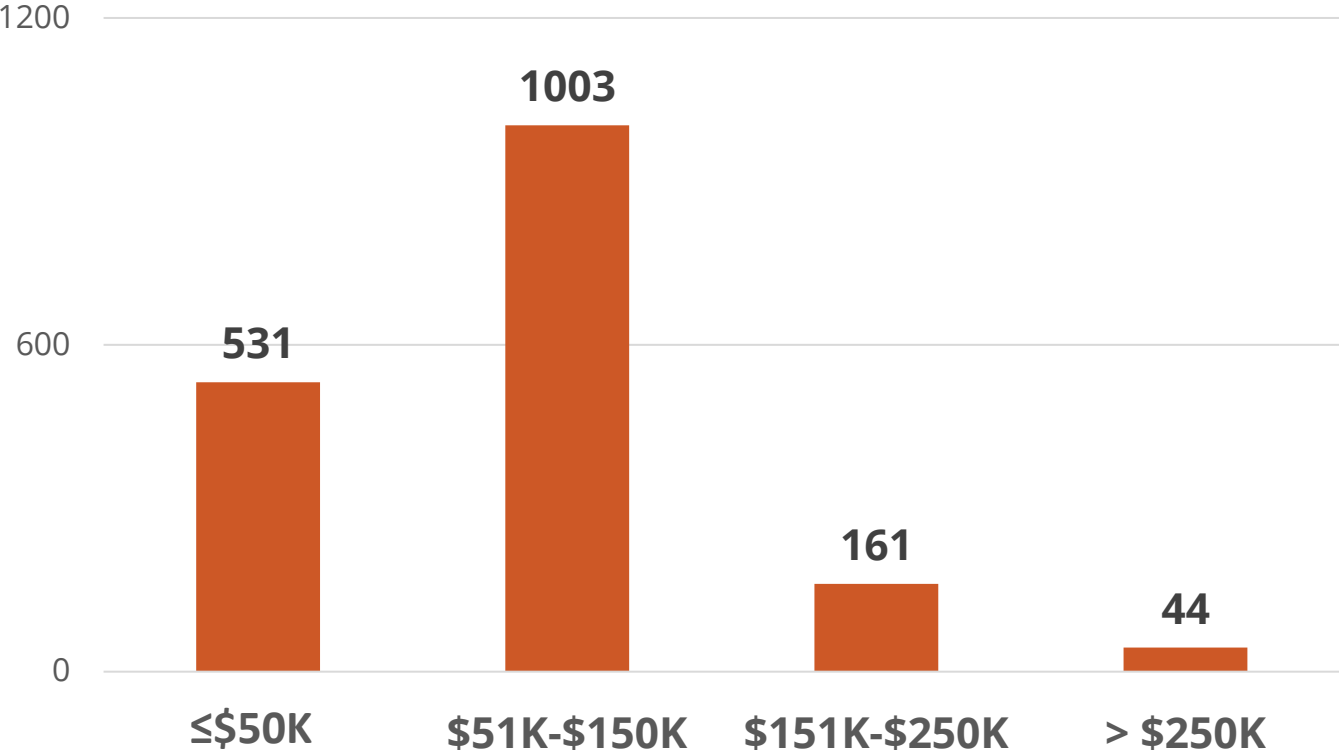
CORE INSTITUTE FUNDING

Number of Grants by Size

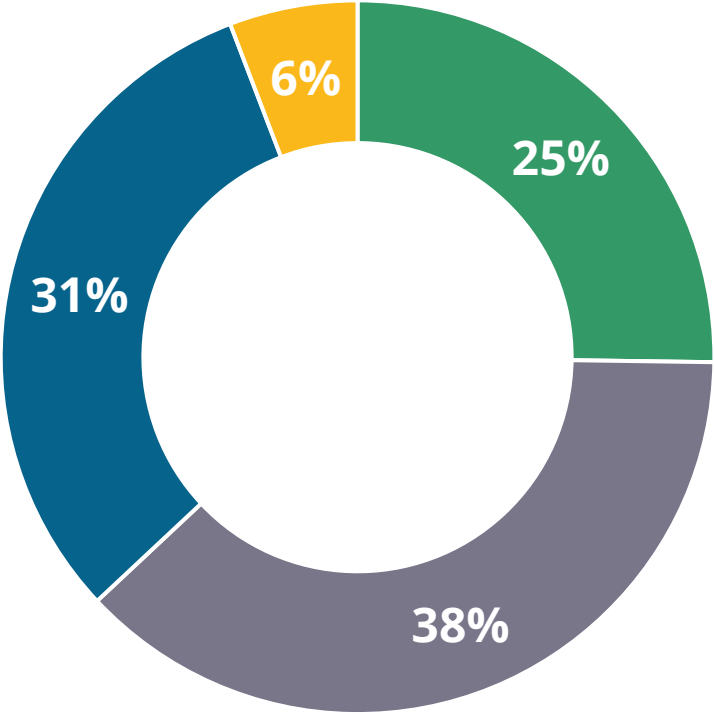

- Engage new actors in the fight against kleptocracy

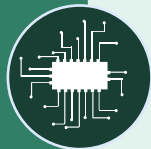
